

Safety: If you are interested in having a **peep hole** installed in your front door, please let Gloria know. With five or more commitments, we have a vendor who will do the installation for \$35.00.

DID YOU KNOW?

- The vehicle entering the gate has the right of way onto Kings Palace Drive?
- Per our Declarations, Paragraph 11.2, window replacement is the responsibility of the owner?
- Lights over your address above your garage door are your responsibility, not the Condominium Owner's Association?
- Per our Declarations, Paragraph 12.5(d), any passenger vehicle not in operable condition or validly licensed and ancillary vehicles may not be parked, kept, or stored anywhere on the condominium property. In addition, failure to register your vehicle is a violation of state law and tow truck drivers are authorized to remove unlicensed vehicles from the property.

Exterior Building Painting

Remember: during the painting activities, please do not park in your driveway during the work time and remove any potted plants or decorations from the outside of your home. Lexie Says: Please remember not to leave pets in vehicles!! Don't put your pet's life in danger! On an 85° day, it only takes ten minutes for the inside of your car to reach 102°, even when the windows have been left open an inch or two. Within 30 minutes, the car's interior can reach 120°. When the temperature outside is a pleasant 70°, the inside of your car may be as much as 20 degrees

hotter. Shade offers little protection on a hot day and moves with the sun. Pets most at risk for hyperthermia (overheating): young animals, elderly animals, overweight animals, those with short muzzles and those with thick or dark-colored coats. ALSO: Uncollected doggie poo continues to be a problem. Please respect your neighbors, and pick up after your dog. There are baggie/collection can stations in several areas around our community. You don't even have to put the poo in your own trash can; you can put it in one of the collection cans and not have to worry about odors in your garage. So no excuses!



GARAGE SALE!!

Our community garage sale is scheduled for Saturday, July 15, from 7:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. This is a great opportunity to clean out those garages and closets and earn a little \$\$\$ too! Each resident uses their own driveway for their sale items. Typically, garage sale visitors start early, so be prepared. The gate will be open during that time frame and closed when the sale is over. PLEASE ask visitors to not park on the grass in any areas. Our streets may be a little busy during the sale,

but there should be plenty of room to park in the street. Residents not participating in the sale, PLEASE park your vehicles in your garage or driveway and leave parking spaces for sale visitors!

REMEMBER...The speed limit in Villa Serena is 15 miles per hour, AND there are EIGHT stop signs. With all the pets in our neighborhood and some children, it is important to obey the speed limit and stop for those stop signs. Busy dogs, kids, and even adults can dart into the road in a heartbeat. Do <u>you</u> want to be the one who runs over a precious life?



Trash Can Etiquette



Thank you to all the folks who are properly managing their trash cans. As a reminder, please be aware that per our Rules and Regulations, trash cans should be set out in the morning of the pickup day and returned to their place in the garage that evening. If there is grass under your trash can, it is sitting in the wrong place! Please move it to the concrete at the edge of your driveway. We pay good money to keep our grass green and healthy. News from Your Neighborhood Watch



A neighborhood watch meeting was held on June 19 and included a presentation from our new Community Relations deputy Kevin Stabins. He provided lots of good information on preventing and reporting criminal activities. The highlights:


- 1) He explained that the Community Outreach Division of the Sheriff's Office conducts **FREE** security surveys. All you have to do is call 813-247-8115 to schedule one for your own home.
- 2) They have a new tool to help you help them keep our county safe. It's called *tip411*. All you have to do is download it to your smartphone or tablet. *tip411* is simple yet effective. You can find the app through the <u>Apple App store</u> or <u>Google Play</u>. Just type in "HCSOSHERIFF" (no space). Download it and keep it handy. *tip411* is easy to use. To send us a tip, press "New Tip." You can also include a photograph or video. Just touch the camera icon at the bottom. All tips transmit instantly to our Communications Center, where the information is directed to the appropriate area, i.e. patrol, narcotics, warrants, etc. We monitor *tip411* twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week. And all tips are anonymous. Remember: in the event of an emergency, always dial *9-1-1*. (http://www.hcso.tampa.fl.us/Articles/Articles/TIP-411.aspx)
- 3) There is a new type of doorbell on the market a video doorbell. It attaches to the front of your home like a standard doorbell but has a video camera that connects to your smart phone. When someone rings that doorbell, you can see via the video feed to your phone who is at your door. How cool is that!!

- 4) If you are a victim of a crime, there are some things you can do to improve the chances of apprehending the criminal.
 - a. If it is an emergency, call 911!
 - b. Write down a complete description of the incident and offenders as soon as possible. You would be surprised how quickly a victim forgets small details.
 - c. If possible, obtain and write down vehicle information.
 - d. Call the non-emergency number for HCSO to report non-emergency activities (for example, a car break-in that you discover in the morning.)
 - e. Notify your Neighborhood Watch, neighbors, NextDoor, etc.
- 5) Always remember: we are the eyes and ears for Sheriff's Office. If possible, do not confront potential criminals. Obtain any pertinent information you can and call HCSO.

Car break-ins are the most common criminal activity in Hillsborough County, and we had one in our community recently. Usually the car has been left unlocked. **The Neighborhood Watch deputy recommends always locking your car, even if you leave it for just a few minutes, and never leave anything of value in your vehicle.** If you are a victim, call the Hillsborough County Sheriff's Office as soon as you discover the break-in. They will send a patrol car to check it out (on a low priority basis). The non-emergency phone number for HCSO is 813-247-8200.

The Neighborhood Watch is always working with the Sheriff's Office to do whatever can be done to reduce all criminal activities. The best deterrent for criminal activity is concerned neighbors. Don't hesitate to call the Hillsborough County Sheriff's Office if you see anything suspicious. Various emergency phone numbers are included here.

The Board is considering using Nextdoor as a tool for sharing information with residents and has already started using it. So far, 120 residents have signed up for Nextdoor. Signing up is easy and free; you input your street address and NEXTDOOR automatically puts you into the Villa Serena
